The history of badminton

Badminton is often played as a casual outdoor activity in a yard or on a beach; formal games are played on a rectangular indoor court. Points are scored by striking the shuttlecock with the racquet and landing it within the other team's half of the court.

Its exact origin remains Games employing shuttlecocks have been played for centuries across Eurasia, but the modern game of badminton developed in the mid-19th century among the expatriate officers of British India as a variant of the earlier game of battledore and shuttlecock. ("Battledore" was an older term for "racquet".)

obscure. The name derives from the Duke of Beaufort's Badminton House in Gloucestershire, but why or when remains unclear. As early as 1860, a London toy dealer named Isaac Spratt published a booklet entitled *Badminton Battledore - A New Game*, but no copy is known to have survived. An 1863 article in *The Cornhill Magazine* describes badminton as "battledore and shuttlecock played with sides, across a string suspended some five feet from the ground".

The game originally developed in India among the British expatriates, where it was very popular by the 1870s. Ball badminton, a form of the game played with a wool ball instead of a shuttlecock, was being played in Thanjavur as early as the 1850s and was at first played interchangeably with badminton by the British, the woollen ball being preferred in windy or wet weather.

Early on, the game was also known as Poona or Poonah after the garrison town of Poona, where it was particularly popular and where the first rules for the game were drawn up in 1873. By 1875, officers returning home had started a badminton club in Folkestone. Initially, the sport was played with sides ranging from 1 to 4 players, but it was quickly established that games between two or four competitors worked the best. The shuttlecocks were coated with India rubber and, in outdoor play, sometimes weighted with lead. Although the depth of the net was of no consequence, it was preferred that it should reach the ground.

The sport was played under the Pune rules until 1887, when J. H. E. Hart of the Bath Badminton Club drew up revised regulations. In 1890, Hart and Bagnel Wild again revised the rules. The Badminton Association of England (BAE) published these rules in 1893 and officially launched the sport at a house called " Dunbar " in Portsmouth on 13 September.

The BAE started the first badminton competition, the All England Open Badminton Championships for gentlemen's doubles, ladies' doubles, and mixed doubles, in 1899. Singles competitions were added in 1900 and an England–Ireland championship match appeared in 1904. England, Scotland, Wales, Canada, Denmark, France, Ireland, the Netherlands, and New Zealand were the founding members of the International Badminton Federation in 1934, now known as the Badminton World Federation. India joined as an affiliate in 1936. The BWF now governs international badminton. Although initiated in England, competitive men's badminton has traditionally been dominated in Europe by Denmark.

Worldwide, Asian nations have become dominant in international

competition. China, Denmark, Indonesia, Malaysia, India, South Korea, Taiwan (playing as 'Chinese Taipei') and Japan are the nations which have consistently produced world-class players in the past few decades, with China being the greatest force in men's and women's competition recently. Great Britain, where the rules of the modern game were codified, is not among the top powers in the sport, but has had significant Olympic and World success in doubles, especially mixed doubles. The game has also become a popular backyard sport in the United States.

Say hello to big, fluffy, absolutely delicious cinnamon rolls packed with a cinnamon brown sugar filling and glazed with a vanilla cream.

Ingredients

For The Dough

500 grams of flour 10 grams of yeast 10 grams of salt 40 grams of sugar 270 ml milk 60 grams of butter 1 egg

For The Filling

90 gr butter, at room temperature 150 gr brown sugar 1¹/₂ tsp cinnamon powder

For The Glaze

100 gr cream cheese 50 gr butter, at room temperature 75 gr powdered sugar 1 tsp vanilla extract 2-3 tbsp milk

Cinnamon Rolls

🕓 ± 2 h 25 m

Method

Make the dough for the cinnamon rolls

Knead all ingredients for the dough - except the butter - into a smooth bread dough. Knead the dough for at least 10 minutes. You can do this by hand or with a mixer. Add the butter and knead it into the dough. Put the dough in a bowl, cover it with plastic wrap and let it rise for 1 hour in a warm place.

Make the filling

Put the butter, brown sugar and cinnamon in a bowl and beat it.

Bake the cinnamon rolls

Grease a baking pan with butter. Roll out the dough into a sheet about 30 x 50 centimeters. Brush the dough with the filling. Cut the roll into pieces and place the cinnamon rolls on their sides in rows in the baking pan. Cover the mold with plastic wrap and let the dough rise for another hour. Preheat the oven to 190 °C. Bake the cinnamon rolls for 25-30 minutes until they are golden brown and cooked. Let the cinnamon rolls cool when they come out of the oven.

Make the glaze for the cinnamon rolls

To complete the cinnamon rolls, brush the cooled cinnamon rolls with icing. For the icing, place the cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar and vanilla extract in a bowl and beat with a mixer. Add the milk until the frosting becomes thick. Brush the cinnamon rolls with the glaze.

In this report we give some explanation about who Noah Fadiga is and of course also about the interview we had with him.



Who is Noah Fadiga?

Noah Fadiga (born on 3 December 1999) is a professional footballer who plays as a right-back for Belgian club Gent. Born in Belgium, he represents Senegal internationally.

A youth product of Club Brugge, Fadiga joined Volendam on loan for the 2019-2020 season. He made his professional debut with Volendam in a 1-1 first division tie with Helmond Sport on 9 August 2020. Fadiga signed with Heracles Almelo in the Eredivisie on 19 July 2020. In the summer of 2023, Fadiga experienced heart irregularities and was not allowed to continue playing in France by the French Football Federation due to their zero tolerance policy in that respect, even though he received a clean bill of health by cardiologists. As a free agent, on 8 August 2023 he signed a three-year contract with Gent in Belgium, his father (Khalilou Fadiga) played for the club 15 years prior.

During the interview we asked him 15 questions about: his career, his father, and his national team Senegal

1)The first question we asked was: "Which team did you dream of playing for as a child?" He replied with: "I always dreamed of playing for Manchester United. When you see how many names they have raised in the football world, you could never go wrong playing for them."

2)After this we asked him if he had any pre game rituals. To this he simply replied "no, I don't believe in such things."

3)The third question we asked him was: "How do you deal with the pressure before important matches?" The answer to this was: "Very good actually, that's why we chose it. A job like this is not for everyone, and of course the competitions that require a lot of stress are really fun, I often really enjoy such competitions.
4) "Who was actually the toughest opponent you faced on the field?" "To be honest, I find every opponent a challenge, but if I really have to choose it would be the players like Messi, Neymar and Mbappe. I think it's a shame that I haven't had the opportunity to play against Ronaldo yet, but maybe that will come!" was his reply.

5) He was very enthusiastic about number five, the question is as follows; "How does it feel to play for the Senegal national team?" his answer was: "Besides the fact that it is a great honour, it is also

a pleasure that I can represent my country at things like the Africa Cup, World Cup and so on."

6) When asked 'What would you like to do when your football career is over?' He had to think for a long time, but in the end his answer was: "I'm probably going to do something in the real estate business just like my mother."

7) He really didn't have to think about this question for long."Where would you really like to play in your career?" The answeris: "The premier league of course, which professional footballerwouldn't want to play there!"

8) "And what is the atmosphere like around the club now?" "The atmosphere is great here! Everyone helps and supports each other, I think that is important at a club."

9) He also liked question 9 because he didn't have to think long about the question 'How does it feel to play against one of the best players, Sadio Mané?' He immediately replied: It is an honor and a pleasure to play with him. I also really look up to him, especially how he behaves. Even though we don't play in the same position, we still understand each other's position!"

10) When asked: "what are your goals for your football career?" he didn't know what to answer, he said: "I don't really know what I am going to do and what I want to achieve, but what I do know is that if I keep doing my best, I will show what I am worth. Time will tell." 11) For question eleven we asked him what was the most
challenging thing about being a professional footballer. He replied:
"The hardest thing is to stay consistent, to know how to deal with
defeats and to keep pushing even when things aren't going as well.
These are things that many professional football players have a
hard time with."

12) "How many hours a week do you spend playing football?" He replied with: "I can't put a fixed number on that, what I can say is that it are a lot of hours. If you know that we have a match almost every 3 days, you can already start calculating."




15) The interview is coming to an end but there was one more question we wanted to ask him: "If you had to choose 1 trophy,


